Carole Belle Popeil (née Weisbard), age 90, passed away peacefully on May 10, 2025, in Lake Worth, Florida. Born on May 22, 1934, in the Bronx, New York, Carole lived a full and vibrant life marked by devotion to her family, a sharp wit, and a deep love for animals.

Carole's early years were spent in the Bronx, where she attended local primary schools before pursuing secretarial training. Her thirst for knowledge continued throughout her life—she later earned a computer certificate from Sheridan Technical College and took liberal arts courses at Broward College simply for the joy of learning.

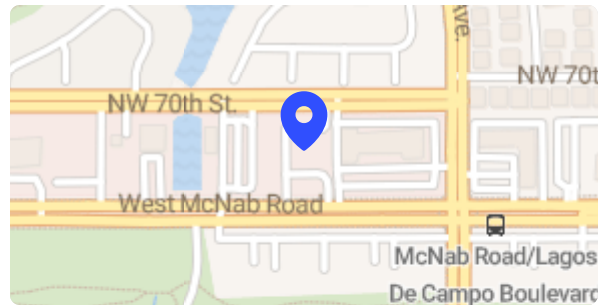

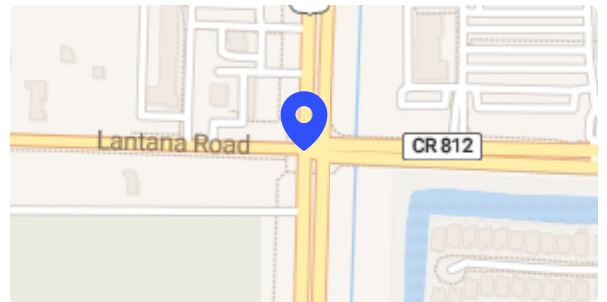
