Arrangements have been entrusted to Alexander-Levitt Funerals & Cremations.

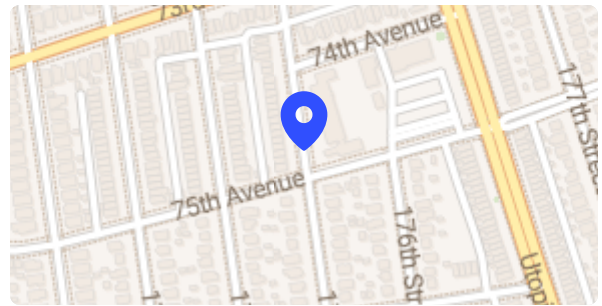

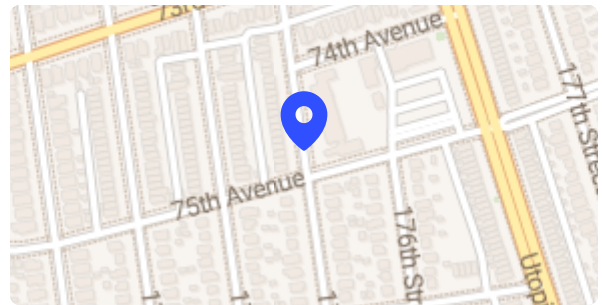
